

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANT FOR ENDLINE REVIEW AND CLOSED OUT PROCESS OF THE 2GETHER 4 SRHR PROGRAMME IN IN KWAZULU-NATAL AND EASTERN CAPE

Purpose of consultancy:	<p>UNFPA South Africa has supported the Department of Health to implement the integration of Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), HIV and Sexual Gender-based Violence (SGBV) services under the 2gether 4 SRHR programme. The programme aims to improve the SRHR of all people in East and Southern Africa (ESA), particularly adolescent girls, young people and key populations.</p> <p>The scope of the programme in South Africa is to strengthen the provision of integrated SRHR, HIV and SGBV services focusing on two UNFPA supported provinces; the Eastern Cape (EC) and Kwa-Zulu Natal (KZN). Three districts in these provinces were identified to have the least progressing indicators on poverty, maternal mortality, HIV and AIDS prevalence and gender based violence, including sexual violence and harmful cultural practices. These were Alfred Nzo and OR Tambo districts in the Eastern Cape and uThukela district in KwaZulu-Natal. In the inception phase, 10 clinics were supported in the Eastern Cape's districts and five clinics in KwaZulu-Natal. A baseline assessment was undertaken when the programme commenced. Thus the purpose of this consultancy is to conduct an end-line review in the 10 facilities in the Eastern Cape and 5 in KwaZulu-Natal.</p> <p>The end-line review will collect data against the same indicators that data was collected for at Baseline for the interpretation of observed changes and impact of the programme. The consultancy also makes inferences to the effectiveness and overall performance of the programme objectives. The consultancy will also include the close out workshop to be undertaken with national stakeholders.</p>
Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	<p>The Consultant will undertake the following activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Collect output, outcome and impact indicators end-line data across the fifteen facilities using 2gether4SRHR data collection tools for January to March 2019, January to March 2020 and January to March 2021. (7 days) 2. Collect qualitative data with key informants among health care workers from 10 clinics from the Alfred Nzo district in the Eastern Cape and five from the uThukela district in KwaZulu-Natal as well as undertake focus group discussions with beneficiaries comprising three groups in the Eastern Cape and two groups in KwaZulu-Natal. (3 days) 3. Capture and analyse End-line data against programme indicators (output, outcome and impact) where baseline data was collected for January to March 2019, January to March 2020 and January to March 2021. The timeline for the baseline was January to March 2018 and the proposed period for the end-line is January to March 2021. (3 days) 4. Develop a report based on the quantitative and qualitative findings to present the status of SRH/HIV scale up, discuss observed trends, describe factors influencing the performance, outline conclusions and note challenges; (3 days) 5. Develop report on comparison of baseline and end-line quantitative and qualitative data for programme performance and effectiveness in the mentioned districts.(2 days) 6. Undertake a workshop with national stakeholders to generate action-oriented recommendations and interventions to address the challenges and gaps identified in the end-line as well as develop road map for scale up in the two provinces. (2 days)
